

# West End: Best End

- Established as White Hall in 1835
- One of the first Streetcar Suburbs of Atlanta
- Listed on the National Register of Historic Places
  - First locally designated historic district in Atlanta
- Home to:
  - Five City of Atlanta parks
  - Hammonds House Museum
  - Wren's Nest
  - A variety of historic churches and religious institutions
  - A collection of unique restaurants, eateries, and breweries
  - Station Soccer
  - Milepost Zero of the Atlanta BeltLine
- Bordered by three Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU):  
Atlanta University Center, Clark Atlanta University, Spelman College

- 27% Without Health Insurance




