Homeowners are facing rising flood insurance rates. Local governments can create insurance discounts for their constituents by participating in the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Community Rating System (CRS) program and earn CRS credits for flood control measures and community outreach.

The Carl Vinson Institute of Government, in partnership with Georgia Sea Grant and the University of Georgia Marine Extension Service, is sponsoring a workshop that will help local governments **learn how to earn CRS credits**.

Open space



Regulatory standards



Voluntary property acquisition programs
