5. Awards.

The GPA recognizes the best of Georgia's planners and planning projects.

6. Membership in GPA provides access to and the opportunity to join the American Planning Association (APA).

APA is the national association for planners. The association is dedicated to helping professional and appointed planners make great communities happen. Planning officials are offered a discounted APA membership and access to articles, trends, resources and planning official best practices from across the country.

7. Volunteer Opportunities.
