 Problems No definitive formulation of problem No stopping rule Solutions: not true-orfalse, but good-or-bad No immediate or ultimate test of solution Every wicked problem is essentially unique. Hard-to-Formalize Contextualized Multidisciplinary Organizational 	 No enumerable set of potential solutions Every problem can be considered a symptom of another problem Can be explained in numerous ways. The choice of explanation determines the nature of the problem's resolution. The planner has no right to be wrong.















































































