
#### **LCI Authorization & Funding**

- Uses federal transportation funds programmed by ARC (STBG Urban >200K)
- Funding provided in Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and programmed in Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
- \$2.25 Million per year allotted for studies
- Approx. \$1.8 Million for grants annually
- \$1 Billion dedicated for LCI transportation projects through 2050 (inclusive of previously spent \$389M)
- Current TIP includes \$133 Million for LCI projects (2023-2028), or an average of \$22 Million per year





# **Greatest Areas of Impact**

#### **Investment in Communities**

Since the inception of the LCI Program, ARC has awarded almost \$24.8M for LCI studies and \$389M for multimodal transportation improvements.



## **Robust Development**



LCIs - which only comprise 4% of the region's land area - have attracted a large share of real estate development in the region since 2000, including retail, hotel, office, and multifamily development.










#### **Strong Housing Demand**







LCIs have seen slightly faster growth in households and housing units than the region.

#### **Higher Housing Density**





Households in LCIs are generally smaller, indicating that housing units are smaller and built at a greater density.




#### **Mixed-Income Communities**

LCI households tend to have lower incomes compared to the region, indicating there are affordable housing options in LCIs (likely due to smaller unit sizes than single-family housing stock that dominates the rest of the region, and younger demographic living in LCIs)

A substantial number of new affordable housing units have been added in LCIs – 35% of all new affordable housing units in the region since 1999 are located in LCIs.









#### **Job Growth and Mixed Uses**

LCIs are strong job centers - 37% of the region's jobs are in LCIs, and 23% of all new jobs regionwide has been in LCIs.

The growth in both jobs and housing in LCIs points to a healthy jobs/housing balance and indicates an increased mix of uses.




#### **Job Wages and Sectors**

LCIs have a large share of high-wage jobs compared to the region.

LCIs also provide a diverse range jobs in other, lower-wage sectors (retail trade, food services, etc.).




#### **Demographics**

LCI residents represent multiple races and ethnicities. 40% identify as Black, and 12% identify as Hispanic or Latino, exceeding the share of these groups in the region.


#### **Transportation**

#### Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT) is nearly 1/3 lower in LCIs compared with the Region.

- Among the original goals of the program was to reduce VMT and solo vehicle trips
  Resulted from an analysis of home-based trips on a typical
- Fall weekday
- Indicates more trips in LCIs are taken by transit, biking, walking or micromobility










## **Housing Costs**


Many LCIs have median rents that exceed the regional average. This includes both in-town and suburban LCIs.





#### **Housing Cost Burden**

About half of renters in LCIs are cost burdened.
This echoes regional trends.






#### **Affordable Housing**

Despite the inclusion of affordable housing in LCIs, there is an uneven distribution of affordable housing units across the Region. Some LCIs have added no new affordable housing.

\*Affordable in this context means legally restricted, income-based affordable housing





#### **Roadway Safety**

LCIs have about 34% of the region's bicycle & pedestrian serious injuries and fatalities.

This may be due to high-speed, multi-lane corridors in LCIs and increased exposure in the densest LCI areas.

Call for a renewed focus on safety for the LCI program and the region.
