
2022 LOCAL PARK ASSESSMENT






Paradise Park












HISTORY







REGIONAL IMPACT

The Red Hills Region is home to over 200,000 acres of native longleaf pine forest, one of the largest privately owned forests in the United States. The economic impact of these privately protected forests is around \$200 million and employs over 1,700 people in the region.

Yet for a vast majority of residents and visitors, this ecosystem remains unseen and unknown.









Sampled 18 longleaf pine Average age 154 years old Oldest tree 1812 Youngest longleaf was 1932

















As I remember it, **Thomasville was a wonderful place to be a child.** It was a small community. You knew just about everybody and everybody knew you... We had wildlife all around, including some quail...

There was a park out front called **Paradise Park**, just across the street from our house... **It was** heavily wooded with longleaf pine and had an open understory. You could see from one end of the park to the other... And I remember vividly there was still wiregrass out there...

It would be an interesting ecological experiment to start putting a fire regime through it...

You might just see some of the former vegetation come back.
